And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Polly Medlock to her and her heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Shrimshire & wife Elinor Merritt, Lazarus Jones & wife and William Barker and wife on or about the tenth day of May A.D. 1827 did exhibit their Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State, against Wheaton Merritt Administrator of Benjamin Merritt stating, among other things that they are the Heirs at Law of the said Benjamin Merritt; that he departed this life some years since his estate seized and possessed of a valuable real estate and
