Now, therefore, this Indenture witnesseth, that the said William Lohoice as Commissioner of the said Court under, and by virtue of the said Decree, and in consideration of the sum of Forty two dollars paid by him the said James Garrett the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained sold and released, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and release unto the said James Garrett his heirs and assigns all that tract of Land situate in the district of Grunville containing one hundred and thirty five acres more or less Beginning at a post oak Corner and running E. 16 to a Stake thence N. 36. E. 14:50 to a red oak tree S. 63. E. 7.50 to a pine thence N. 21. E. $\frac{37}{100}$ to a black Jack thence N. W. 54 to a Stake thence S. 63.
