The State of South Carolin. I know all men by these  
presents that I Thomas Benson of Greenville District and  
State aforesaid, for an inconsideration of two hundred dollars  
to me paid by James L Springfield of said District Have granted  
bargained, sold and released by these presents do grant, bargain  
sell and release unto the said Springfield all that tract or par-  
cel of land supposed to be one hundred acres more or less  
situated in the district aforesaid on the waters Enore River, and bounded  
by Lands of said Springfield, said Benson and Robert Benson's. dued the  
time beginning on a Stake at the old road thence N. 41. 8. 39. ch to a  
Spanish Oak thence S 15. E 13. Ch. 20. to a black oak thence to the  
mouth of a small branch thence down the meander of a large  
branch to the mouth thence up Enore River to a Stake cor. on the  
South Bank thence S. W. to a Stake on the edge of the swamp thence up  
the edge and south side of side of said swamp to a persimmon tree  
above the old road thence to the beginning. Together with all and  
singular the rights, number, hereditaments and appurtenances to the  
said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining  
to have and to hold all and singular the premises before  
mentioned unto the said James L Springfield his heirs and as-  
signs forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and  
administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and sin-  
gular the said premises unto the said Springfield his heirs  
& assigns against myself and my heirs and against every
