

them humanely, to pay all their tax during that time, he has the whole benefit arising from the plantation & Mill, connected with it and the use of the Annexed Schedule of Tools & Stock the fields called the Clover fields he is not to cultivate for the two following reasons he is at liberty to clear as much bottom as he pleases and to use for sawing all such timber as will not make Railes, but to cut other timber, but for Railes, or fire wood he is to have no other but his own family on the land, to preserve as far as practicable all the trees planted either for use or ornament & to cultivate the land in the manner agreed on & to repair the fences & buildings so as to prevent either from going to ruin as far as can be done by him on the whole it is now clearly understood that he is during the time he has the property in possession to use it as an industrious honest man as he would his own the said Earle to be at no Expence with or at the property while he has it in possession on the first day of January 1835 he is to return to the said Number & Value of stock of hogs Cattle and Horses and the same quantity of Hodder and Grain as he now reaves with the Negroes, ^{&c} then increase unavoidable accidents excepted the plantation Horses fences in as good order as they now are with all such improvements as he may make Intersimoney whereof the said David Terry & Samuel Earle have hereunto set their hands & seal, the 22nd of January 1830.

South Carolina } It is further agreed by and between the said Greenville District } Samuel Earle and David Terry as part of the foregoing demise that the said David Terry shall also have the use and occupation of the grist and saw mill belonging to the said Earle on the middle Fork of Saluda from the date of this instrument until the first day of January 1835 intended to be included in the foregoing Contract for the land and negroes and it is hereby commanded and agreed between them that the said mill shall be kept during the term in reasonable repair at the Expence of the said Terry and at the end of the term that they with the stone, saw, all irons and other things appertaining to either of the mills shall be returned to the said Earle in good order natural wear & tear and unavoidable accidents by flood and fire excepted it being understood that the said Terry is to take the same care & pains in the use of the said mills and appurtenances that a prudent man would of his own property Witness their hands and seals the 22 day of January 1830 *J.
