 the aforesaid Joseph Edwards and Mary his wife during their life  
 time for their own benefit and use and no other and at their death  
 or deaths the same to return again to me or my heirs or assigns  
 and I hereby bind myself and my heirs not to intercept them con-  
 cerning the same during their natural lives In witness whereof  
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of January

 Deed of the District of Pendleton in the State aforesaid as well as the sum  
 of one dollar to me in hand paid Have given granted bargained  
 and sold a certain piece parcel or tract or a part of a tract  
 of land lying in the district and state aforesaid on the road leading  
 from Greenville Court House to Pendleton Old Court House  
 Containing one hundred and fifty acres to include the im-  
 provements buildings and the present cleared land now in  
 cultivation being a part of a tract of four hundred and  
 seventy four acres which I purchased from Capt W. E. Wickoff  
 which deed is recorded in the Clerks office of Greenville  
 District in Book P. a reference being had thereto will  
 more fully shew the boundaries and courses and it is the intent  
 and meaning of this instrument of writing for the said Mrs
