 these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Harrison J. Clark his  
 heirs and assigns for ever the said tract, lot and parcel of land, together with  
all the appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise incident or  
appertaining, and all the Estate right, title, interest and claim  
whatsoever which the said William Clark deceased of right had, or  
in or to the same to have and to hold the said tract, lot and parcel of  
land, with the appurtenance, unto the said Harrison J. Clark his  
heirs and assigns, for ever, as fully and absolutely as I the Sheriff as  
aforesaid might, could or ought to grant, bargain and sell the  
same by virtue of the order from the Court of Ordinary of the District  
of Greenville aforesaid. In witness whereof, I the said James Mc-  
-aniel Sheriff have hereunto set my hand and seal the Twenty  
third day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and thirty, sealed, signed and delivered in the presence

 Nancy Roark, Abraham Hill, James Roark, Jonathan Armstrong  
 and George his wife, Mary Merchant Carter wells and Nancy his  
 wife Edward Baldwin and Piggy his wife, Daniel Womels and  
 Charlotte his wife, Catharine, Isabella, Delah and Anna Roark.
