Sycamore River Containing two hundred and twenty one acres in the same more or less beginning at a maple thence up the branch to a stake thence N. 86 E 23. 80 to a red oak thence N. 45 W 18. 90 to a white oak thence N. 15 E. 10 to a stake adjoining William Neaves land thence N. 45 E 38. 75 to a hickory thence N. 10 W. 7 to a post oak thence to a stake thence S. 80 W. 49. on Mr. Neaves line to a white oak thence N. 10 W. 2 to a stake on the Creek thence up the meander of the Creek to a red oak corner thence N. 35 E 23. 50 thence to a post oak corner adjoin. John Nichols land thence a straight line to the beginning. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said Henry Wood his heirs and assigns for ever and we do hereby bind our selves our heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend the aforesaid premises unto the said Henry Wood his heirs and assigns against all others and have him and against any other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof for witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this twenty fourth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
