One Thousand eight hundred and thirty seven file his bill of complaint in the Court of Equity in Greenville District in the said State against David Blythe the Administrator of Thomas Blythe deceased number Valley & wife Esther, Johnathan Blythe, Daniel Blythe, Martha Blythe, Widows of John Blythe, Sally Blythe, Polly Blythe, and Sarah Blythe children of William Blythe, Sally Barr Widow of Sally Barr and her children, William Blythe Elizabeth Blythe, Mary Blythe John Blythe and others children of John Blythe, stating among other things that Thomas Blythe died on the day of May preceding leaving a large real estate and praying for a writ of partition to have the said real estate divided among those entitled to the same or for a general order of the Court to have the said Estate sold for partition among the heirs of the said Thomas Blythe and the cause being before the said Court came on to be heard before the Honorable Chancellor Draper was at Chamber on the day of November thereafter, when the said Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the said real Estate should be sold at Public Auction by the Commissioner of the said Court, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in this general order, as by reference thereto in the Registry of said Court will appear.
