

South Carolina This indenture made this second day of Ma  
Greenville District & ch in the year of our Lord One thousand eight  
hundred and forty two between Watson Ordinary of the district  
aforesaid and William J. Dacus of the same State and District  
Whereas a writ of summons to deville or sell a certain tract of land  
hereinafter described of the Estate Jacob Black late of s. District  
Dees. issued from the court of Ordinary of said district and upon  
the return thereof the Judge of said Court did determine that  
the land could not be devilled without injury to the interests  
of the parties and did order the same to be sold by the  
Sheriff of the district aforesaid on a credit of twelve months—

Whereupon the Sheriff aforesaid did advertise the said land for  
sale on the first Monday in January A.D. 1840 And whereas the  
Sheriff aforesaid did on the said day expose to sale at publick out-  
cry on the credit aforesaid the said land when William J. Dacus  
was the last and highest bidder to whom the said land was struck  
off for the sum of four hundred and eight dollars

Now this indenture witnesseth that in consideration of six hundred &  
Eight dollars to me paid or secured to be paid I have granted bargained  
sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and  
release to the said William J. Dacus his heirs and assigns forever all  
that tract of land situate in said district on Reedy River containing two  
hundred acres more or less it being a tract of land originally granted  
to Francis Brunar the third day of April One thousand seven hundred  
and Eighty four and hath such bounds marks and &c as follows:

Beginning at Reedy River running East 60 chs to a Dogwood  
tree 30 & 55 chs to a White Oak thence 160 N 10 to Stony Creek thence  
down Stony Creek to Reedy river thence up the River to the beginning  
corner which said tract of land was conveyed by Samuel Pyle to the  
aforesaid Jacob Black dees. the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March One thousand seven  
hundred and ninety four and same conveyed as the estate of said  
Black with the appurtenances thereto belonging and all the estate  
rights title interest claim or demand which the said Jacob Black  
at the time of his death had in or to the same "To have and to hold  
the said tract of land together with all and singular the premises  
improvements and appurtenances to the said William J. Dacus  
and his heirs and assigns forever. In witness whereof I  
the said John Watson as ordinary aforesaid have hereunto
