The tract of land whereon I now live on the waters of Little Mountain Creek waters of Moore River. Containing about One hundred acres bounded by lands of W. E. Wickliffe Daniel Pitt & James Hooker with the present crop thereon. One cow and calf ^{1/4} head of hogs all the plantation tools. household and kitchen furniture. and every other article appertaining to the said lands houses trees. tools crockery. pottery. provisions. Bedding. Chain. tables ^{etc} &c to be theirs forever from me and my heirs and from every other person whatever in any wise claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
