Thence North 21 East three hundred and forty eight feet (348) to a stake on the avenue leading from McLeod's 20 feet from the academy line - thence South 90 East One hundred and twenty eight feet (128) to a stake. Thence South 20 West along the line of the academy avenue to the beginning; Containing One acre and 25 poles; Being the same piece or lot of Land conveyed by Varday M. Bee to Perry E. Duncan on the 29th day of May 1830. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining. To Have and to Hold all and singular the said premises, before mentioned unto the said R B Duncan his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said R B Duncan his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person or persons whomever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
