 mare about sixteen Years Old about thirteen and a half hands high and one Bay
 Colt Two Years Old this Spring one Cow and four Sheep marked with a Crop
 and half Crop in the right ear and a half Crop in the left ear the under Side of the
 ear one Walnut Cupboard one Cherry Table one feather bed & Furniture to have
 and to hold the said property to the Said Lewis H. Dickey to him his Heirs forever
 provided the Said Powers shall fail to pay and discharge the above sum of
 Forty nine Dollars and Eighty six Cents on or by the first of December next and
 if the Said Powers do pay or discharge the debt then this Mortgage to
 be void and of no Effect signed and Acknowledged in the presence of us
 This 16th of March 1841 —

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State of South Carolina, This Indenture made the fifth day of -
 Greenville District. August one thousand eight hundred and
 five and in the twenty ninth year of American Independence between William —
 Anderson Sheriff of Greenville District of the one part and William Mc Mahan
 planter of the other part witnesseth where as Cornelius Mc Mahan deceased was —
 Seized and possessed in his lifetime to a certain piece or Tract of Land containing
 Four hundred & ten acres lying & being within this District on both sides of
 Ratlams Creek and that he the said Cornelius died intestate and by Petition of the —
 legateas of said deceased the said land was ordered by his Honour Justice Elijah D. —
 Day, then sitting in State term one thousand eight hundred & five, to be sold
 on the first Monday in May following to the highest Bidder giving twelve
 months Credit and that I said Sheriff did give due notice of said vendue by
 advertisement and other wise and did on said first (monday) expose the same —
 to sale, I. William Mc Mahan did give said land two hundred and fifty dollars
 the at that price being the lowest and highest bidder and the receipt is
 hereby fully Acknowledged the said Lands buttins and boundaries
 are as following Beginning on a Black Oak running N 66 E to a
 Black oak thence W 66 E to a Stake thence S 66 E to a Stake thence
 E 66 to the Beginning Together with all and Singular the premises —
