Kinman his Executors, administrators, and assigns forever, freely, quietly, peaceably, and entirely, without any contradiction or assurance of any person, and without any account to me or to any other, whatsoever, to be made, answered or hereafter to be answered so that neither I, the said Winifred Kinman nor any other for me or in my name, ought to exact, claim or demand, at any time or times hereafter any right, title, interest, or demand of note or for the said Slaves Waggon & Horses or part or parcel thereof, but from all action right title estate claim demands, Possession, and interest thereof shall be wholly barred and excluded by force and virtue of these presents, and I the said Winifred Kinman for myself and Executors and administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Slaves, Waggon and Horses unto the said Thomas W. Kinman his Executors administrators and assigns against me the said Winifred Kinman, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever of which Slaves Waggon and Horses mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and I the said Winifred Kinman have put the said Thomas W. Kinman in full possession by delivering of the same in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16 day of February 1842
