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William Davenport, The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these-  
To Greenville District, I present that I, William  
Francis Davenport, Raverport of the State & district aforesaid for and  
in consideration of the natural love & affection I have  
for my son Francis Davenport, and in consideration of the sum of one dollar  
to me in hand paid by the said Francis Davenport of the State & district aforesaid,  
have granted, bargained, sold, released & given, and by these presents  
do give, grant, bargain, sell & release unto the said Francis Davenport, for  
the purpose of raising his family on & for the sole use & benefit of himself and  
family during his life but not at his disposal and at his death to his children  
a plantation & tract of land lying in the State & District, on the waters of horse  
creek of Ready River, it being the plantation that the said Francis Davenport  
now lives on, Beginning in a Red Oak 3x. on S. Southerly line thence running N. 88 $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  
E. 42, to a p. O. 3x. thence E. 8. E. 6. 25. to a Stake, thence E. 88 $\frac{1}{2}$ . E. 17. 75. to R. O. 3x.  
thence N. 10. E. 24. 50. to a Stone 3x. thence E. 5 W. 26. 25 to a stone 3x. thence E. 85. W.  
13. to a P. O. 3x. thence N. 87. W. 20. 50. to a pine 3x. thence S. 24. W. 58. 50 to the beginning.  
Containing one hundred & ninety six &  $\frac{3}{4}$  acres be the same more or less, but retaining  
to myself & wife the privilege of using any of the timber on the place as long as either  
of us lives and at our death to be given up to the said Francis Davenport and family  
Together with all & singular, the rights, members, hereditaments & appurtenances, to the  
said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have & to hold,  
all & singular the said premises, abovementioned unto the said Francis Davenport, for  
the use of the said Francis Davenport & his family during his life and at his death to his  
children forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs executors & administrators  
to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises to the said Francis  
Davenport & family during his life, and at his death, to his children, their heirs and  
assigns against myself and my heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully  
claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof, Witness my hand & Seal this  
22<sup>d</sup> day of Feby A. D. 1838, and in the 62<sup>d</sup> year of the Independence of the United  
States of America.
