Keyah Jane McCullough - among Districts by these present
Recorded for 15th April 1843. and State aforesaid, for and in consider-
ation of the love and affection which I bear unto my daughter
Keyah Jane McCullough, wife of James McCullough, and in
consideration of the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid by
James M. Sullivan of the District of Greenville & State aforesaid
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted han-
gained Sold and delivered, and by these presents do bargain sell
and deliver all and singular the negro slaves herein named, to
Beverly, a man twenty one years of age, Pernelia, a girl eighteen
years of age, Isaac, a boy fourteen years of age, Mary, a wo-
man thirty eight years of age, Sarah, a girl twelve years
of age, George, a boy three years of age, & Virginia, infant
female Child of the said Mary, together with all the future in-
crease of the said Female Slaves, Posture and Postold all
and singular the said Slaves and their increase aforesaid, unto
the said James M. Sullivan, his Executors and Administrators
forever, upon the special trust and confidence, nevertheless
and to aid for the several uses, intents and purposes hereinabove
mentioned and declared, and for no other purpose nor or intent
whatever, that is to say - In trust to permit and suffer the sd
Keyah Jane McCullough, to have, hold, possess, employ or
hire out the above named Slaves and their increase aforesaid
and to appropriate the proceeds thereof in any manner she
may think proper without the interference or controll of any
person whatever, and without being liable to the present or future
creditors of the said James McCullough or those of any future hus-
band in any manner whatever for and during the term of her na-
tural life and at her death for the use and benefit of such
child or children as she may leave her surviving share, and
share alike if more than one but should she die without leaving
a living Child or children and her said husband surviving, in
that event the said Trustee is by these presents authorized
to sell the aforesaid Slaves and their increase on a reasonable
credit, and to pay over one third of the proceeds thereof, to the sd
James McCullough and the remaining two thirds to the said
Joseph Sullivan, if living but if not living to his executors or
administrators as the case may be for the use of his estate as his
will may direct, or should he die intestate then to be applied in
the course of administration - As it is my desire that the said
