E. Westmoreland and Mitchell. Beginning at on a P.O. 3x. Water's corner, at 20 W. 20. Pin 3x. N 55. E. 55 to a Stake in the State road thence along the State road S. 29. E. 22. 75 to a Stake in the road S. 60 W. 20. 75 S. 34 W 14. S. 65 W 9. S. 72 W 5. 80 to the beginning. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Henry Darby his heirs & assigns forever - and I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Henry Darby his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person or persons whosoever shall lawfully claim the same or any part thereof.
