 eight hundred & forty three and in the sixty seventh year
 of the independence of the United States of America,

 aforesaid for and in consideration of
 one hundred and twenty five dollars
 in hand paid, have granted, bargained and sold &
 unto Jacob Garrett & Pleasant Garrett their heirs & assigns
 a certain tract of land lying on the long branch, water
 of Gilsons Creek containing fifty acres more or less. Be-
 ginning on poplar on Mr. Johnson's line, it being a
 conditional line between the two parties, running thence
 to the spring which is now occupied by Nicholas Gar-
 rett, stoned continuing on nearly the same course to a
