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Col. D. Hooke & Maj. B. F. Penny. I, William M. Goodlett, Sheriff of Greenville District, and State aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereas, by Writs of Fieri Facias, issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for the District of Greenville, one tested the twenty-fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three at the suit of William Choice to me directed, commanding me, that of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements, of James Gidley, to levy the sum of four hundred and thirty \$ 89/100 Dollars damages and costs, I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of the said James Gidley, all that certain piece, parcel and tract of land, containing more or less, two hundred and thirty-seven acres, situate and being in the District of Greenville, on the waters of South Pacolet River, adjoining lands of Josephine Emberry, et al, And whereas, the said premises, with their appurtenances, since the seizure by me made, by virtue of the said Writs of fieri facias before mentioned, have been exposed to sale at public vendue, and purchased by Col. David Hooke and Maj. B. F. Penny of the District and State aforesaid, for the sum of forty-five Dollars, being the highest sum that was bidden therefor: Now know ye, That I, William M. Goodlett, Sheriff aforesaid, by virtue of the said Writs of fieri facias aforesaid, to me directed and delivered as aforesaid, and by virtue of the statute in such case made and provided, and for and in consideration of the sum of Forty-five Dollars to me in hand paid, or secured to be paid by the said Col.
