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Know all men by these presents that I, John Spriggs of Greenville District and State aforesaid, for the inconsideration of Six hundred dollars to me in hand paid by William Cox of the same State and District have granted, bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said William Cox a certain tract or parcel of land situate in the District aforesaid, on both sides of the Middle Fork of Saluda River original granted to Thomas Brunet and Stephen Phillips beginning in a hickory stump corner running South 45 East 22.24 to a stake & thence South 67 W. 22 to the mouth of a ditch thence down the meanders of the River to the mouth of the first branch thence up the branch to a white oak corner thence South 68 W. to a white oak & thence N. 45 W. 28 to a post oak South 45 W. 24.50 to a stake & thence N. 21 W. 24.50 to a post oak & thence N. 44 W. 8.50 to a post oak corner & thence South 38 E. 8 to a pine Samuel McCandless & No. 60 E. 46 chains to a stake on the River, thence down the river until it intersects the original line say granted to Thomas Brunet thence in said line to the beginning aequable to a resurvey made by George Salmon the fifteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven containing one hundred and fifty-five Acres be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Cox his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executars and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William Cox his heirs and assigns, against myself, my heirs, and against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
