ful to and for the said John Bryson peaceably and quietly to hold,
use, occupy, possess and enjoy all and singular the premises above gram-
med and released, and every part thereof, with the appurtenances, and to have,
receive, and take the rents, issues and profits, to his own particular use
and behoof, any thing herein contained to the contrary hereof in any wise
notwithstanding.

This Indenture, made the seventeenth
day of July in the year of our Lord one thou-
sand eight hundred and forty-four between John A. Leland, Superinten-
dent of Public Works of the State aforesaid, of the one part, and Ru-
bin Tally, of the other part:

Witness, The said Rubin Tally stands indebted to the said
John A. Leland, Superintendent as aforesaid by Bonds for the sum of
Forty-One Dollars and three cents payable in three annual instalments,
with interest from the date hereof. That is to say, one third part with
interest, on the seventeenth day of July, 1845, one other third part with
interest, on the seventeenth day of July, 1846, and the remaining third part
with interest, on the seventeenth July, 1847.
