P. Butler, as Commissioner of the said Court, after having duly advertised the said Tracts of Land for sale, by public entry, on the said Sixth day of October first above mentioned, did, then openly and publicly, and according to the custom of Auctions, sell and dispose of the said Tract of Land No. 5 below described, unto the said Joseph L. Goodwin Jr. for the sum of Five hundred and thirty Dollars being, at that price, the highest bidder for the same. Now therefore, this Instrumente witnesseth, That the said T. P. Butler, as Commissioner of the said Court, under, and by virtue of the said Decree, and in consideration of the sum of Three Dollars paid him by the said Joseph Goodwin Jr. the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents, doth grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Joseph Goodwin Jr. his heirs and assigns, All that Part Piece, Parcel or Tract of Land known and called the David Terry Place, situate lying and being in Greenville District on Beaverdam Creek, Waters of North Fork of Saluda River, containing Two hundred and fifty six acres more or less it being composed of two or three Survey's, and conveyed by Phil. Gavis to David Terry and by David Terry to John Hightower, now bounded by the lands of Nancy Murray and others, having such metes and bounds as represented by Plat's Survey's attached, sold as the lands of John Hightower died together with all and singular the hereditaments, rights, members and appurtenances whatsoever, to the said Tract of Land, belonging, or in any wise appertaining; and the revisions and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possession, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever, both at Law and in Equity, of the Heirs and representatives of the said John Hightower and of all the Parties to this Suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof, by, from, or under them, or either of them: To have and
