


that I, John W. Hampton of

Polk County, N. Carolina for and in consideration of the sum of
one dollar to me in hand paid by Andrew Loftis of G. Car-
olina, & Greenville District the recd. whereof is herein acknowl-
edged. Have released unto the said Andrew Loftis his heirs
& assigns all my right title & claim to a certain tract of
Land, situated on Wild Cat Creek, waters of South Tyger
River, in the State of S. Carolina of Greenville District, known
as the Loftis Mine Beginning at a stake on Wth Branch's
line, thence West to a P. C. thence C. to a Rock on the
side of the hill, S. E. to a poplar on the branch, thence
up the meanders of the branch, to the Spring through the
spring, a straight line till it intersects the branch, up
the same branch up to the head, thence a straight line
to B. C. or the widow Smith's line, thence W. E. to the
beginning. Containing one hundred & twenty four acres, more
or less. This the third of April A. D. 1847, & in the 71st
year of American Independence.
