Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining And I the said Wesley Phillips do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators forever to warrant and defend the above granted premises unto him the said James West his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and assigns and against any and every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof.
