Vaughn deceased of the same and District. In consider-

ation of One Hundred and Twenty nine dollars to me in hand by Ethel Hodsclaw of Greenville  
District and State aforesaid the receipt whereof is fully acknowledged have granted & bargained  
sold and quit claimed and by these presents do bargain sell and quit claim unto the said  
Ethel Hodsclaw and to his heirs and assigns forever all that and each of their rights titles  
and Interest estate claim and demand both at Law and Equity and as well in pos-  
session and expectancy of in and to all that certain farm a piece of land that was  
owned by the above named Hammon Vaughn at the time of his death situated in  
Greenville District on Brushy Creek waters of Counce River containing One Hundred  
acres more or less and hath such boundaries wheras beginning on a Stake corner from  
a ash 37 on the James Wards branch down branch to Brushy Creek running  
down said creek to John Wests line thence along said line to a post oak in the  
field. Thence along the original line to the beginning on the branch it being a part  
of a tract of land originally granted to Isaac Morgan all that lies, during  
the premises. Together also another tract a parcel of land containing five  
acres lying on said waters bounded on the east side of the above described tract of  
land and hath such boundaries wheras beginning on a Stake on Rains line on a branch  
from thence down said branch to a Stake corner on Rains line along said line to  
West Spring Branch to a Stake thence said branch to a post oak from thence a  
straight line to the beginning it being a part of a tract of land originally granted  
to Aaron Kemp and Paul Abram grants bearing date January the 1<sup>st</sup> 1785 and January  
the 5<sup>th</sup> 1795 in the whole One hundred and five acres more or less with all and be-  
gatious the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging
