

daughter shall be held in Trust for my heirs generally and the said Trustes James Emory Hopkins and John Lewis Hopkins. Shall suffer my said daughter to have her use possess and enjoy respectively the slaves truly conveyed in deed for them and suffer them to receive and enjoy the profits arising therefrom according to the terms of this deed and at this death shall hold the same in Trust for the parties to whom the Trust shall succeed upon the same terms and conditions and if at any time either or any of the said Slaves should become unmanageable, or from necessity or other causes it should be deemed prudent and desirable to sell any or either of said Slaves the said Trustes shall with the written consent of the party entitled to the Trust estate in such slave or Slaves proceed to sell such slave or slaves and transmit the proceeds thereof in such property Real or personal as the said parties may with the acquiescence of the said Trustes determine upon which property shall be held upon the terms and for the same purposes use trusts and purposes as the Slaves from the proceeds of which such property may be purchased, now held, For the event that either of the Trustes aforesaid shall die or shall desire to relinquish his trust in this may be ascertained in the place and stead by the written consent of the Trustee surviving or continuing and the other parties to this Deed which Trustee when so appointed shall be substituted to all the rights held by his predecessor under this deed
