This Indenture made the second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four between Samuel A. Trower Esq; a Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Common Pleas and Distinct at Greenville County House in the said State of the one part and William Cox of the other part witness Isaac McCoy and Caroline McCoy a minor by C. W. Scott his Notary Public on or about the twenty seventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three doth witness this Bill of Complaint in the name of Legate at Greenville County House in the said State against Susan Cox and others praying for Partition of the Real Estate of John Cox deceased.

And the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at Charleston in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty three the 1st instant when the Court after full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises doth order adjudge and decree that the Plaintiff described John Finch, a friend of family should be trustee in the said William Cox on the terms and for the purpose mentioned in this present Order as by reference thereto in the Registry of the said Court will appear.

Wherefore in this Indenture witnesseth That the said Samuel A. Trower as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said Act and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand and Seventy Seven Dollars paid him by the said William Cox the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold and released unto the said William Cox and his heirs and assigns all that Job Finch, a friend of family known and described by a Survey and plan thereof as follows viz Beginning at a Red oak 343 ft from S 6° E 10.55 Chappel 3x dead and down Thence down banks back to the old bed of the River and along thence to mouth of ditch, Thence up said River to Black Gum 343 ft from N 45° W 9.20, Hickory 34 ft from S 84° W 9.00 to the beginning containing parts of Calico Good wife John Cox deceased and John McRighteous containing Twenty Nine acres all of which lying and being situated in the State and District aforesaid.

Together with all and singular the hereditaments, rights, Members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said John Cox deceased belonging or in anywise appertaining unto the Presidency and Admiralty, Admirals, and Profits thereof and also all the Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Honour Possession Property Benefit, Claim and Demand whatsoever both at Law and in Equity of the said and his executors, takers of the said John Cox deceased and of all the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof by them or under them or either of them.

To have and to hold the said Land with its hereditaments, Privileges and appurtenances unto the said William Cox his Heirs and assigns to him and their sole proper use and benefit forever.
