Beginning at a Pine and running N 73<sup>o</sup> W 26.00 to a W. O. thence S 30<sup>o</sup> W 8.84 to a Persimmon thence N 22<sup>o</sup> W 19.70 to a chestnut thence S 40<sup>o</sup> E 26.75 to a W. O. thence S 48<sup>o</sup> W 10.84 to a Post oak thence S 88<sup>o</sup> W 31.07 to a black oak. thence N 11<sup>o</sup> W 36.86 to the beginning Pine corner containing One thousand & forty three acres more or less.
