William Cantrell for the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty five Dollars in hand paid by the P. William Johnson the receipt is hereby acknowledged hath bargained sold & delivered and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto William Johnson a certain tract or parcel of land containing forty acres be the same more or less being in the State and district aforesaid lying on both sides of the Reedy fork a branch of the Middle fork of Saluda River it being a part of a survey laid out and granted to Ephraim Ellis and beginning on a Locust on the North line of S Survey thence N 44 E to a stake thence S 46 E 25 chains to a stake thence S 45 W to a chestnut thence to the Beginning corner conditional line made between Swan Cantrell and William Cantrell, to have and to hold all and singular the woods waters and waters courses and whatsoever belonging to the same and I the P. William Cantrell do warrant and for ever defend the aforesaid premises unto the P. William Johnson his heirs and assigns for ever from my self my heirs and assigns and all other persons lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof. - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this February the 11<sup>th</sup> 1869
