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in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Charles Gosnell of the same State and District aforesaid have granted bargained sold and conveyed by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Charles Gosnell a certain tract or parcel of land situated in Greenville District on Branch waters of South Pacolet, Beginning on a Hickory thence 20 E 35° 50 links to a chestnut thence N 61 E 8.50 links to a dogwood thence North 25 W 25 links to a red oak, thence N 10 W 39.50 links to a hickory thence S 20 W 26 to a Red oak thence South 25 E 20 to Spanish oak thence S 30 W 32 to red oak thence an offset about of 5 chains near a south east corner to a chestnut thence S 82 E 15 to a Locust thence S 80 E 29.50 to the beginning corner containing 277 acres more or less also a another, tract 20 acres more or less deeded to him by Jacob Lindsey, beginning on a Stake thence a conderinal line to a marked chestnut thence to a marked Spanish oak thence to a marked white oak thence to the original line thence from the beginning Stake also a parcel or tract of land known as apart of the Phillips land apart of the land that he sold to George Ballou
