being thereunto have well more fully appeared. Know all men that we the said
Charles P. and Pleasant Mayfield in consideration of the said debt and sum of
money aforesaid and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said
William M. Thomas according to the condition of the said bond and also in
consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to us the said Charles P. and
Pleasant Mayfield in hand well and truly paid by the said William M.
Thomas at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents. We receipt whereof
acknowledge we the said Charles P. Mayfield and Pleasant Mayfield have
granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain
and sell and release unto the said William M. Thomas all that tract or parcel
of land situate lying and being in Greenville District on Billings Creek
containing Two hundred and twelve acres more or less and adjoining
lands of Willard Wood and others and more particularly described
in a deed from William M. Thomas Commissioner in Equity for Greenville
District to said Charles P. Mayfield and Pleasant Mayfield dated on the
Fifth day of October Anno Domini 1863. Together with all and singular
the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold
all and singular the said premises unto the said Wm. Thomas and his
heirs and assigns forever. And we Charles P. Mayfield and Pleasant Mayfield
do hereby bind our heirs and heirs executors and administrators to warrant
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Wm.
Thomas and his heirs and assigns from and against his heirs executors adm.
inistrators and assigns and every other lawfully claiming or to claim the same
or any part thereof. Provided always nevertheless and it is the true intent and
meaning of the parties to these presents that if we the said Charles P. Mayfield
and Pleasant Mayfield do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid
unto the said William M. Thomas the said debt or sum of money aforesaid
with the interest thereon if any shall be due according to the true intent
and meaning of the said bond and condition herein written. Then
this deed of bargain and sale shall cease determine and be utterly
null and void otherwise it shall remain in full force and virtue. And
it is agreed by and between the said parties that Charles P. & Pleasant
Mayfield to hold and enjoy the said premises until default of payment
shall be made a copy of said bond is endorsed hereon

aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Richard H. Jacobs all
that piece parcel and tract of land containing two hundred and fifty acres
more or less. Situate lying and being on the south west side of Huddy River
in the District and State aforesaid. And having the following line, post and
bounds viz. beginning at a hickory tree on a branch called the Little house
branch and running thence down said branch to Brushy Creek thence up
the meanders of said Creek to a sweet gum tree on the upper line of the
original grant thence 166 1/4 28.75 to a stone tree 120 20.20.25 to a stone
tree in an old field. thence 33 1/4 65 1/2 to the beginning being part of a tract
of a tract of 861 acres granted to Boyle of Earle June 7th 1830. and being
also the same tract conveyed by Richard H. Jacobs to me by deed of January
28th 1863. Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments
