The first tract is situated on the water of Brushy Creek waters of Sandy River and containing Fifteen Acres, beginning at a Post oak and running thence N 38 E 12 chs to a Red Oak thence N 81 E 475 to Post oak on the Augusta Road, thence along said Road 11 chains to the Bridge State corner of said Bridge thence up the ditch and meanders of Brushy Creek to a Stake thence South 13 East 1550 to a small Hickory stake 162 1/2 rods to a Stake thence N 6 E 8.50 to the beginning The second tract is situated also on the water of Brushy Creek waters of Sandy River containing One Hundred Acres more or less beginning at a Post oak on Brushy Creek and running thence N 6 E 25 chs to a Stake S 47 E 47 to a dead Pine S 47 E 2026 to a Stake S 47 E 37 1050 chs to a Stake thence down the meanderings of the Brushy Creek to the beginning corner the present growing crop on said land also a large Post put in a furnace also the tree plants on said lands are reserved by the said James McRaeon the Oaks are also reserved.
