Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said James P Moon as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said Decree and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred and five dollars paid by the said Aya Stanton the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said Aya Stanton her heirs and assigns all that tract or lot of land situate in Greenville District in the State aforesaid on the north side of South Tyger River beginning at a point on said River at a stone 34 w and running thence N 64° E 45 to a stone 34 n thence S 75° 40' E 10' 10 to a stone 34 n thence N 64° W 45 25' to a small knoll 34 n on said River thence down said River to the beginning corner and containing Thirty five and three fourths acres more or less together with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging or in anywise appertaining. And the possession and remainder rents issues and profits hereof and also all the estate right little interest down possession property benefit claim and demand whatsoever both at law and in Equity of the heirs and representatives of the said George Dill deceased and of the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof by from or under them or either of them to have and to hold the said Land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances unto the said Aya Stanton her heirs and assigns to her and them only proper and lawful and behoof forever In witness whereof the said James P Moon as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said Decree hath caused to set her hand and seal of the Court on the day and year first above written signed sealed and delivered in the presence of 3 Alexander McElveen Jefferson Ward 3 James P Moon 3
