and in the State and District aforesaid on a branch of Rocky
Creek of Enore River and having such marks and boundaries
as follows Beginning on a Walnut 34 near the dam on my place
thence S 87 1/4 E 11. 25 to a Stone 34 thence S 31 1/4 W 10. 50 to a Holly 34
thence N 32 W 11. 20 to the beginning corner containing four acres
more or less and with the right of using the water from the dam on
my place for the purpose of a distillery. Together with all and
singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the
said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, to
them and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the
said Nancy Mason and her heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby
bind myself, my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever
defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Nancy Mason

Thruston of Greenville District State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Thomas B. Thruston his heirs executors and administrators fall that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in the Corporate limits of the town of Greenville, described in Deed made the 16th day of April A.D. 1863 by Willis & John Benson to John G. Lopez and recorded in Clerks Office Book 7 Page 272, as land conveyed to the said Willis and John Benson by William McGoodlett bounded on south by lands of J. T. Brooks West by D. G. Westfield East of the Augusta road commen- cing at a stake on said road south of the house & running hence S 60 W 7. 34 to a stake thence N 7. 75 E 11. 34 to a stake on the Augusta road thence along said road to the beginning corner and all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in the incorporation limits of town of Greenville commencing on the Augusta road thirty feet from the corner of J. T. Benson lot containing all the land owned by us in the fork between the Augusta road and the Greenville & Columbia Rail Road running a street thirty feet (30') wide starting from the Augusta road and running along the N. E. side of said Benson lot to the Rail Road said lot being purchased with partnership funds and was part partnership property which is described in Deed by J. G. Lopez to Thos. McGeorge Henry & Marks to John G. Lopez the 11th day of June A.D. 1864. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to them and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Thomas B.
