McDaniel & others	Land	This Indenture made the fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven between James P Moon Esquire Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville Court House in the said State to the one part and Frank B. McDaniel & C. S. McDaniel the two children of W. C. McDaniel deceased of the other part, Thomas Vardry McDaniel and Alexander McDaniel Executors of the last will and testament of Vardry McDaniel deceased on or about the twenty ninth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty six exhibited their Bill of Complaint in the Court of Equity at Greenville Court House in the said State against Malinda P. McDaniel et al. and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court came on to be heard at July term in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven when the said Court after full hearing thereof, and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that a certain portion of the real estate of Vardry McDaniel deceased, as recommended by the Commissioners in partition should be conveyed by the Commissioners of the said Court on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their decree, order as by reference thereto in the registry of the said Court will appear to the children of W. C. McDaniel deceased. Now therefore this indenture witnesseth that the said James P. Moon as Commissioner of the said Court under and by virtue of the said decree and in consideration of the sum of three dollars paid him by the said Frank B. McDaniel & C. S. McDaniel & C. L. McDaniel children of W. C. McDaniel deceased the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said F. B. McDaniel & C. S. McDaniel & C. L. McDaniel jointly their heirs and assigns all that certain tract of land within and adjoining the Town of Greenville containing One Hundred and Seventy five acres more or less, heretofore known in part as W. C. McDaniel's farm and by reference to the writ of Partition as tract No. 24 and more particularly described by the plat attached hereto. Together with all and singular the hereditaments unto right members and appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and remainder thereon and profits thereof, and also all the estate right little intent however possession property claim and demand whatsoever both at law and in equity of the heirs and representatives of the said Vardry McDaniel deceased and of the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same on any part thereof by from or under them or either of them. To have and to hold the said land with its hereditaments, profits and appurtenances unto the said F. B. McDaniel & C. S. McDaniel & C. L. McDaniel and

C. L. McDaniel jointly their heirs and assigns to them and their only proper and lawful and behalf forever
