Mortgage that Estate	The State of South Carolina This indenture made the twenty fourth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight between Edward Knights of the one part and Whitfield Brooks & James L Brooks of the other part, witnesseth Whereas the said Edward Knights stands indebted to the said Whitfield Brooks and James L Brooks in the sum of Eight hundred Dollars by three sealed notes bearing date respectively January 1 st 1867, the one for three hundred dollars payable two years after date four for three hundred Dollars payable three years after the date a third for two hundred Dollars payable four years after date each bearing interest from date payable annually as will more fully appear by reference to the said notes so just mentioned the amount of sixteen hundred Dollars. Now the indenture witnesseth that the said Edward Knights for and in con- sideration of the premises aforesaid and also in consideration of the sum of Four Dollars to the said Edward Knights by the said Whitfield Brooks and James L Brooks in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Whitfield Brooks and James L Brooks all that lot or parcel of land on which the said Edward Knights resides situated in Greenville District and State aforesaid about one mile from the public square of the Town of Greenville bounded on the lands by lands of the said formerly W Banks west by Mr Banks lot formerly Mr McRae's place North by a street and East by lot of G L Cobb formerly G L Gomers lot being the same lot and premises conveyed by the said Whitfield Brooks & James L Brooks to the said Edward Knights by deed bearing even date with this indenture containing three acres more or less together with all and singular the rights, members, instruments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appur- tenant thereto and to hold all and singular the premises the premises before mentioned unto the said Whitfield Brooks and James L Brooks their heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Whitfield Brooks & James L Brooks their heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming to be owner the same or any part thereof. Provided always nevertheless and it is the present intent and meaning of the parties to these presents that if the said Edward Knights his heirs, executors or administrators shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Whitfield Brooks and James L Brooks the sum of eight hundred Dollars and interest according to the note aforesaid above mentioned, then and from thenceforth these presents shall be utterly null and void, anything written contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding And it is consequently so agreed and agreed by and between the parties to these presents that an account shall be made in pay- ment of the aforesaid sum before due forth and the interest for the same it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Edward Knights peacefully and quietly to hold and occupy premises and enjoy all and singular the premises aforesaid granted and released and every part thereof with the appurtenances, and to have and receive and take the rents issues and profits thereof to his own particular use and behoof, anything written contained to the contrary

Cents each and due and payable respectively at two and
Four years from the respective dates of each and also to
one William Cox of the District and State last aforesaid in
the full and just sum of Seven hundred and six Dollars
and fifty six Cents by my Promissory Note drawn payable to
the William Cox for the said last mentioned sum one day after
the date thereof and dated the 10th day of April 1868 and signed
also by the said John Germany, to the best of my belief
that I the said James St Germany for and in Consideration of
the Premises aforesaid and also in Consideration of the sum
of one dollar to and in hand paid by the said Hamlin
