Bolling deceased, of the one part and L B Waldrup of the other part Witnesseth Whereas the said L B Waldrup in and by certain obligation under his hand and seal bearing even date herewith stands bound unto the said Louisa C Bolling Executrix in the sum of seven Bales of good merchantable first cotton each to contain four hundred pounds, or of six bales of cotton weights sum as above. And One Hundred Dollars, condition for the payment of two Bales on delivery of them presents, and one hundred dollars on one Bale of cotton on first day of March 1869 One Four (4) Bales of cotton 1 <sup>st</sup> day of Dec 1869 as will fully appear by reference to said obligation. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said L B Waldrup of the State & County aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid and also in consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said L B Waldrup by the said Louisa C Bolling in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Louisa C Bolling Executrix as aforesaid all that tract peer and parcel of land known as the Peden place situated and lying in the State County aforesaid described as follows beginning at Post oak and running North 26 <sup>o</sup> to public Roads ch, thence W along said road 47.50 ch to stone fence line 33.40 to State line 8.47.50 to beginning bounded by lands of Stevens Peden & others & containing One hundred & fifty acres more or less as will more fully appear in deed of conveyance for said tract of land. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or pertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Louisa C Bolling Executrix her heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Louisa C Bolling Executrix her heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof provided always nevertheless and it is the true intent and meaning of the parties to these presents that if the said L B Waldrup his heirs, executors or administrators shall fail and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Louisa C Bolling Executrix the sum of one Bales of 98

Merchantable cotton or one hundred dollars & six bales of cotton according to the provisions contained in the above mentioned obligation him and from henceforth thereafter presents shall be utterly null and void anything herein contained to the contrary hereof in anywise notwithstanding, and it is covenanted and agreed upon by and between the parties to these presents that until default shall be made in payment of the aforesaid sum as before set forth and the interest thereon it shall and may belong to and for the said L B Waldrup peaceably and quietly to hold use occupy possess and enjoy all and singular the premises above granted and released and every part thereof with the appurtenances and to have receive and take the rents issues and profits thereof to his own particular use and behoof, anything herein contained to the contrary hereof in anywise notwithstanding.
