D. Bullman planters of Greenville County of the other part all of the state aforesaid witnesseth that the said Allen McDaniel agent of aforesaid agrees to furnish to the said James McDaniel & Elyah Farmer J. D. Bullman from time to time during the present year six tons of Wando Potash per month per ton and such further quantities thereof as to the said Allen McDaniel agent may claim pro per not exceeding in the whole to be used by the said James McDaniel & others

Farmer J. D. Bullman in the cultivation of their plantations in
the county of Greenville and state of South Carolina or such other plantations
as they may cultivate in consideration whereof the said James McDaniel
and Elyah Farmer J. D. Bullman do hereby sell transfer and agree
to deliver to the said Wando Mining and Manufacturing Company
so much of the Cotton or other produce raised on said plantations
or plantations during the present year upon the gathering of
said crop or any part thereof as shall be sufficient to pay or
satisfy them for the advances thus made which consideration and
transfer is intended to create in favor of Said Wando Mining
and Manufacturing Company the said terms by and under the
act of the Legislature called an act to secure advances for
agricultural purposes approved and ratified on the twentieth
day of September A.D. 1866 and is intended to be a law binding
the crops raised during the present year on said plantations
or plantations in preference to all other items of claims existing
or otherwise to the extent of such advances aforesaid with all
the powers rights and remedies by the said act provided and
it is further agreed that the claim for the first crop of 1866
under this agreement shall be due and owing at the date
of delivery of said Potash or parts thereof and that the
said debt so created shall arise existing and take effect upon
the said crop or part thereof as the same shall be gathered to the
extent of the value of the Potash or these fixtures and that
the taking of a draft negotiable note or other security shall
not suspend the immediate enforcement of the said debt

given to any person or persons whatsoever any bill upon
