this Indenture made the 7<sup>th</sup> day of March

A B Vickers Esquire Sheriff of Greenville County South Carolina  
of the one part. And Charles G Garrison of the other part  
Witnesseth Whereas A B Vickers on or about the 3<sup>rd</sup> day  
of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and seventy did exhibit his petition in the Court of Probate at  
Greenville Court House in the County of Greenville and State  
aforesaid against Daniel H Whittleck praying that the real  
estate of Robert Whittleck Deed be sold for partition amongst  
the heirs of said Deed. And the cause being at issue before the  
honorable Court of Probate said cause came onto the record on the third day  
of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and seventy when the said Court after full hearing thereof and  
matron deliberation in the premises did order adjudged and  
decreed that the said Real Estate should be sold at public auction  
by the Sheriff of Greenville County South Carolina on the terms  
and for the purposes mentioned in the Decretal order in the said cause  
as by reference to the same in the Registry of said Court will appear

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Real Estate belonging or in anywise incident or appurtenant. And the reversion and remainder next issues and profits thereof. And also all the estate right title interest, power, possession, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever both at Law and in Equity of the heirs & representatives of the said Robert Whittleck and of the parties to this suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof by from or under them or either of them.
