 paid me by the said John P. Pool Sen the receipt  
 whereof is hereby acknowledged Have granted  
 Bogdan sold and released and by their presents  
 do grant Bogdan Sen and heirs unto the said  
 John P. Pool Sen and his heirs and assigns All that  
 Tract of land situated lying and being in the  
 State and County aforesaid on waters of James  
 Kessels Bogdan by lands of Estate of Joseph Kellogg  
 William Goldsmith and others and containing  
 one Hundred and sixty one and three fourths  
 Acres more or less. Situated in the Division as  
 lot no. 1 and is represented in Plat made by W. D.  
 Shields Deputy Surveyor of said State to the same  
 will more fully show Together with all and  
 singular the rights incidents Hereditaments &  
 and appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract of  
 Land belonging or in anywise appertaining
