

Hundred acres more or less it being of two Survey  
one originally Granted to Joseph Stroble in the year 1789  
and the other Survey originally Granted to William  
Guthrie &c in the year 1816 and bounded on the  
East by lands now belonging to the widow & heirs  
of Solomon Dauchet deceased of Greenville District &  
on the south by said Saluda River and on the west  
by John Masters his land & having such shape as  
Ded for the same represents & made to Thomas Masters  
in to wit Beginning on a Pecan tree corner on the  
bank of Saluda River at or near the mouth of a  
Branch thence running up the side of said branch  
till it strikes the back or North line of the said land  
and running thence N 45 E along said line to a Stake comm  
on said Survey then S 32 E 53 c to stake thence S 80 E to  
the corner on the River bank which is the corner of  
the old Survey as laid out to the said Stroble then up  
the meanders of the said River to the Beginning corner  
which is also a corner of the last name Survey  
in the said tract of Land which our Father Thomas  
Masters & died Lawfully Sceoz'd and part of and the same  
also vested in his widow Leah Masters who was  
afterwards inter married to one Silas Dauchet whom  
is also dead and our said Mother whom died as the  
widow of said Dauchet was possessor of at her death  
was still in possession of said land we the only  
lawful heirs do as above name see unto the said  
John Masters as above described said Land together  
with all and singular the rights members hereditaments  
and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any  
wise incident to have and to hold the said tract  
or parcell of land before mentioned for ever in fee simple  
unto the said John Masters his heirs & assigns we do  
herself bind ourselves our heirs executors & administrators  
to warrant & forever defend the said premises against our  
selves our heirs executors and administrators & also  
against all other persons or persons lawfully claiming  
the same or any part thereof in witness whereof we  
have hereunto set our hands this 13  
day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand  
Eight hundred eighty one (1881) begun seal & delivered in presence  
of Just Alexander & Lewis Farmer O.P. *Date*  
William Masters *Date* Maudie M. Masters *Date*  
The State of South Carolina William Masters this day personally  
Picton District appeared before me Alvin A. Parker  
Publick for said District & whom being duly sworn to the  
truth deposes & saith on oath that he saw the  
witness named Farmer O.P. & Maudie M. Masters sign  
seal & deliver the writing deed of conveyance  
for the said purpose having been taken before  
me this 13th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand  
Eight hundred eighty one (1881)

and Alexander Edie was present and subscribed these  
names then to the witness to the due Execution of the same  
Sworn to and Subscribed this 13 day January 1851

John Bowen and the heirs of Mrs<sup>(Bowen)</sup> Sutherland dec'd and viz  
Sarah Sutherland David Matherne James H. Sutherland &  
J. B. Sutherland of the state aforesaid and District of Hickory  
for and in consideration of the sum of twenty two \$22  
Dollars to us in hand paid John Mastin of the State and  
District aforesaid have Granted bargained sold & released  
and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey  
unto the said John Mastin his heirs & assigns a certain  
tract or parcel of land containing one Standard forty  
five acres be the same more or less situate in the State  
& District aforesaid on the waters of Hickory Creek off  
Saluda River on both sides of the Hickory road adjoining  
the N. E. line and the said Bowen & Sutherland Beginning  
on a Hickory on the North Carolina line at 13 E 65 to  
a tree since N 34 1/2 W 5.31 to B.O. tree 84 1/2 ft 80 to a rock  
thence S 28 1/2 W 50 to Chestnut oak tree 88 1/2 ft 840 to poplar  
st. on the same & more to a rock thence S 34 1/2 W 4.80 to a B.O.  
thence S 84 1/2 W 50 to a B.O. tree 83 1/2 ft 5 to a ft. o. tree 86 21  
30 to a Maple at the branch thence N 84 6 25 to a Stake on  
the old line thence N 26 E 44 to the Beginning Hickory  
Together with all and singular the rights man  
rents & appurtenances hereto belonging or in any wise  
incident or appertaining to have & to hold all singular  
the said premises unto the said John Mastin his heirs &  
assigns forever and we do hereby bind our selves & each of  
our heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant forever  
defend the said premises unto the said John Mastin  
his heirs & assigns forever against our heirs & assigns  
and all other person or persons whom same  
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part  
thereof of him under our hands & seals this twenty first  
day of October 1867 in the year of our Lord thousand eight  
sixty seven signed sealed & delivered in the presence of  
Mary E Bates
