and have granted Bargained sold and released and
by these presents do grant to him sell and release it unto the
said Henry Forrester a certain tract or parcel of Land situate
located and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid on
the west side of Elisha Thompsons Branch creek of Middle
River Beginning at a stone 31 on said Creek & running S.
88° W. 210 to a stone 31 Red oak tree then S 72° E 723 to a Hickory
stone 82¹/₄ N 3236 to a stone 31 in a field R 0 gone thence S 74°
W. 2790 to a stone 31 Red oak dead & downe then S 76° E 2650
to a stone 31 then S 37° E 3275 to a Red oak S 78° 3¹/₄ E 10,50
to a maple 31 on said Branch Creek then up said creek
with the meander to the Beginning containing three hundred
and fifty acres more or less together with all and
mian the rights franchises appurtenances to the
said property belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining
to have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned
unto the said Henry Forrester his heirs & assigns forever And I do
hereby bind myself my heirs & executors under Administrations
to warrant & forever defend all and singular the said premises
unto the said Henry Forrester his heirs & assigns against me and
my heirs and any other person whomsoever lawfully claiming
or to claim the same or any part thereof witness my Hand
& Seal the 19th day of December in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and seventy three and in the
ninetieth year of the Independence of the United States

Carolina praying the benefit of the act of Congress entitled an
act to establish a uniform System of Bankruptcy throughout
