Bowden for the sum of Twenty nine hundred Dollars, who transferred his bid to Mrs Mary Bowden, who has complied with the terms of sale, but has never received a deed to said land, now know all men by these presents that W. A. McDaniel Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County in said State, in consideration of the premises and by virtue of an order of the Honorable Thomson H. Cooke Judge of the Eighth Judicial Circuit of said State dated April first A.D. 1874 have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell, and release unto the said Mrs Mary Bowden all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and a being on Faulet River in said State and County, containing Seven hundred and ninety six acres more or less, Beginning at a Chestnut 34 N 30 W 24 to a P. 0. 34 thence N 26 W 6 to a R.
