running thence N 60 W 33.50 to Stake near two white oaks
37 thence N 20 E 31.50 to small Hickory on the bank
of an old ditch 37 thence up the old ditch & branch or
ditch to Maple 37 thence S 5 W 9.50 to Black Gum 37 thence
S 85 E 3.5 to Stake 37 thence S 40 W 18 to S 0.3 thence N 60 W
16.60 to Stone 37 thence S 38 N W 82.42 to the beginning this
place is known as the McColanahan place and contains
three hundred acres more or less together with all and
singular the rights Members agreements and appur-
tenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise
incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and

presente's trust we Ambrose Smith and S. M. Watson
both of the County and State aforesaid in consideration
of the desire we have to promote the cause of Christ
as well as the sum of one dollar to each of us in hand
paid by James Meadows Lynn W. Watson Jr and Ambrose
Smith Trustees of the welcome Baptist Church of the Com-
munity aforesaid have each granted given and
released and by these presents do grant give and release
unto the said Trustees a certain parcel or lot of land
containing one and $\frac{1}{2}$ acres and $\frac{1}{2}$ acre respectively
situate lying and being in the County and State aforesaid
at the fork of the White Horse and Stanton Bridge
roads; the same forming one Lot containing one and
 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, bounded on the North by land of J. M. Union
on the East by land of William Blythe, on the South by
land of A. Smith, and on the West by the said Smith
and Watson. Beginning on a Post Oak 13 ft. on White
Horse road, and running thence with said road N 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ W
16.34 chs to a stone 37 m. thence S 13 W 3.17 chs to a stone 37 m.
on thence S 18 W 6.34 chs to a stone 37 m. on Stanton Bridge
road thence N 13 E 3.17 chs to the beginning Post road
