

to facilitate the sale and transfer of said lands, had agreed to meet amongst themselves, to convey all of the said lands in trust, to two of their number to sell and divide the proceeds of sale amongst the partners, according to their respective interests; and prayed amongst other things that these matters might be inquired into, and if found practicable to carry out the said agreement in reference to a trust Deed, that a suitable Trust Deed be reported, together with some suitable person or persons to act as Trustee or trustees; and whereas, upon the said cause being heard, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June A.D. 1874 it was referred to a Special Reference, to report on the various matters embraced in the pleadings in said cause, and upon the report of said Special Reference coming in, containing the various recommendations therin more fully set forth, and it was on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August A.D. 1874 amongst other things, ordered that William Symmes & Thomas C. Gower, be appointed Trustees, to whom William A. McDowell, Clerk of the said Court, should convey the said lands, to have and to hold the same to them and upon the purposes uses and trusts, as set forth and declared in the deeds reported by the said Reference, and whereas, the said William A. McDowell, Clerk, as aforesaid, did convey the lands mentioned in the pleadings to the said Trustees;

I now therefore, Known all men by these presents, that we Thomas C. Gower and Whittier Symmes Trustees as aforesaid, by virtue of the power conferred upon us, in and by the Order and trust deed aforesaid, upon the written request of the parties whose trust herein endorsed, and in performance of our duty as such trustees and also in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars to be paid by J. D. Smith before the delivery of these presents, have granted, bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said J. D. Smith all that piece parcel or lot of land being of the parcels of the lands above mentioned situate and lying in the City of Greenville and State of South Carolina, commencing at a Stake on Binnie Street running thence N 28 1/2 E three hundred and thirty feet to Rail Road thence S 59 E two hundred and seventy four feet 3 in to a Stake at Rail Road, thence S 28 1/2 W three hundred and ten feet to Stake on Binnie Street thence with said street N 61 1/2 W Two hundred and seventy two feet 3 inches to the beginning containing two acres more or less adjoining lots of Wilson and Peach together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or pertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said J. D. Smith his heirs and assigns forever freed from and discharged of all further trusts whatsoever and we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend, all and singular the said premises unto the said J. D. Smith his heirs and assigns against us and our heirs and every other person whom we shall fully claiming or to claim the same in any part whereof by whomsoever and under what title or titles aforesaid.
