The State of South Carolina  
Deed Whereas, on the eighteenth day  
of May A.D. 1874 Edmund  
Westfield and Whitmer Symmes Plaintiffs exhibited  
their Complaint for relief, &c in the court of Common Pleas  
for the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, against  
Thomas M. Cox Thomas C. Gower William Birnie and  
others defendants wherein amongst other things it was  
alleged that one John Westfield now deceased, on the  
day of A.D. 1873 sold and conveyed to the Plaintiff  
Whitmer Symmes and Thomas M. Cox and Thomas C. Gower  
the defendants, and to one James Birnie, also now deceased, an  
undivided from (4-5) fifth his interest in and to certain Real Estate  
in and around the City of Greenville, in the County and State  
aforesaid, and more particularly described in the deed of convey-  
ance of that date; and on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1873 the  
said John Westfield, agreed to sell to the firm of Cox Birnie & Co.  
which was composed of himself, and others parties (as above named)  
certain other lots pieces or parcels of land in, and near the said City  
of Greenville, and County and State aforesaid, and were particularly  
described in said agreement; and that the said parties who were inter-  
ested in the land above mentioned, in order to facilitate the sale  
and transfer of said lands, had agreed to and amongst themselves  
to convey all of the said lands in trust, to two of their number  
to sell and divide the proceeds of sale amongst the parties, according  
to their respective interests; and prayed amongst other things that  
these matters might be inquired into, and if found advisable  
to carry out the said agreement in reference to a trust deed  
that a suitable trust deed be prepared together with some suitable  
persons or persons to act as trustees; and whereas, upon the  
said cause being heard, on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1874 it was referred  
to a special referee to report on the various matters embraced in  
the pleadings in said cause, and upon the report of said special  
Referee coming in, containing the various recommendations ther-  
eupon more fully set forth it was on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1874  
amongst other things, ordered that Whitmer Symmes and Thomas  
C. Gower be appointed trustees, to whom William Williams A. McDer-  
mott Clerk of the said Court, should convey the said lands  
to have and to hold the same, to, for and upon the purposes  
uses and tenures, as set forth and declared in the deed so pur-  
ed by the said Referee and whereas, the said William A. McDer-  
mott Clerk as aforesaid did convey the lands mentioned  
in the pleading to the said Trustees and whereas the said  
Trustees were ordered to convey the lots heretofore sold by the  
parties upon the purchaser complying with the terms of sale  
now therefore I give all men by these presents that we Thomas  
C. Gower and Whitmer Symmes Trustees aforesaid do give and  
confer all the powers conferred upon us in and by the order and trust  
deed aforesaid and in performance of every duty as such trustee  
and also in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and  
eight Dollars to us paid by W. C. Gower A. S. Williams and
