Gower & Symmes Trustees To W B Millwee	Deed	The State of South Carolina Whereas on the eighteenth day of May A.D. 1874, Emma M. Westfield and Whitmer Symmes Plaintiffs, exhibited their Complaint for Relief &c in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, against Thomas M. Cox Thomas G. Gower William Birnie and others Defendants, wherein amongst other things it was alleged that one John Westfield, now deceased, on the day of A.D. 1873 sold and conveyed to the Plaintiffs Whitmer Symmes and Thomas M. Cox &c Thomas G. Gower the Defendants, and to one James Birnie, also now deceased, an undivided four (4-5) fifths interest in and to certain Real Estate, in and around the City of Greenville in the County and State aforesaid, and more particularly described in the deed of Conveyance of that date; and on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day of September, A.D. 1873, the said John Westfield, agreed to sell to the firm of Cox, Birnie &c, (which was composed of himself and other parties last above named) certain other <del>parties</del> lots pieces or parcels of land in and near the said City of Greenville, and County and State aforesaid and were particularly described in said agreement; and that the said parties who were interested in the lands above mentioned, in order to facilitate the sale and transfer of said lands, had agreed to and amongst themselves, to convey all of the said lands in trust, to two of their number to sell and divide the proceeds of sale amongst the parties, according to their respective interests, and prayed amongst other things that these matters might be inquired into, and if found advisable to carry out the said agreement in reference to a trust deed, that a suitable trust deed be reported together with some suitable person or persons to act as trustee or trustees; and, whereas, upon the said cause being heard, on the 17 <sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1874, it was referred to a special Referee, to report on the various matters embraced in the pleadings in said cause, and upon the report of said special Referee coming in, containing the various recommendations therein more fully set forth, it was on the 7 <sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1874, amongst other things, ordered that Whitmer Symmes and Thomas G. Gower, be appointed trustees, to whom William A. McDaniel, Clerk of the said Court, should convey the said lands, to have and to hold the same, to for and upon the purposes, uses and trusts, as aforesaid and declared in the Deed reported by the said Referee and whereas, the said William A. McDaniel, Clerk as aforesaid, did convey the lands mentioned in the pleading to the said trustees. Now therefore know

all men by these presents, that we, Thomas G. Gower and Whitmer  
Symmes, Trustees as aforesaid, by virtue of the power conferred upon  
us in and by the order and trust deed aforesaid, upon the written  
request of the parties aforesaid herein endorsed, and in performance  
of our duty as such trustees and also in consideration of the sum of  
Two hundred and one Dollars, to us paid by W. B. Millwee before  
the delivery of these presents, have granted bargained sold and re-  
leased, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto  
the said W. B. Millwee all that piece parcel or lot of land being par-  
cel of the lands above mentioned situate and lying in the City and  
County of Greenville in the State aforesaid commencing at a stake on  
Railroad purchase and lot No. eleven running thence N 4 1/2 E One  
hundred and forty three feet and nine inches to a stake corner of lot  
No. nine thence N 85 1/2 E one hundred and fifty feet to a stake corner lot  
No. twelve thence N 4 1/2 W one hundred and eighty eight feet and three  
inches to a stake corner of lot No. eleven thence S 55 1/2 W seventy nine  
feet and seven inches to a stake on lot eleven thence S 85 1/2 W eighty one  
feet and five inches to the beginning corner and known in Dickson's  
Survey as lot No. ten, also that other lot or parcel of land in the City  
County and State aforesaid commencing at a stake on lot No. ten running  
thence S 4 1/2 E One hundred feet to a stake on street thence N 85 1/2 E  
One hundred and fifty feet to stake on lot No. twelve thence N 4 1/2 E  
One hundred feet to a stake on lot No. ten thence S 85 1/2 W one hundred  
and fifty feet to the beginning corner and known in Dickson's Survey as  
lot Number nine. Together with all and singular the rights mem-  
bers hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging or in  
anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and sing-  
ular the premises before mentioned, unto the said W. B. Millwee his heirs  
and assigns, forever freed from and discharged of all further trusts  
whatever, and we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs executors and  
administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular  
the said premises unto the said W. B. Millwee his heirs and assigns  
against us, and our heirs and every other person, whomsoever lawfully  
claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof, by, through and  
under us, as trustees aforesaid.
