ain sell and release unto the said Thos W Davis all  
that tract or parcel of land situate in the County of  
Greenville in State aforesaid on the waters of Cooee  
River and containing one hundred and thirty five  
acres more or less, and adjoining lands of Simon Bow-  
ell, Robt. Green, Nancy Snow, Thos. B. Brown and  
others together with all and singular the rights  
members hereditaments and appurtenances to the  
said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or  
appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular  
the premises before mentioned unto the said Thos W  
Davis his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby  
bind myself my heirs executors and administrators  
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the  
said premises unto the said Thos W Davis his heirs and  
assigns against me and my heirs and every other person  
or persons lawfully claiming, or to claim the same,  
or any part thereof.
