and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and  
fifty Dollars to me paid by W.S. Walker in the State  
aforesaid we have granted bargained sold and released  
and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto  
the said W.S. Walker, all that certain piece or parcel of land  
situated about two miles Northward from Landrum Station  
and known as the "Black House" property, and more fully  
described as follows: Beginning at a Rock on the North  
East corner of Greenville Co. State of South Carolina  
and running thence West along the State line seventy  
seven chains to a chestnut tree South Eighth ch and  
34 L thence South 61 E sixty four chains, to a chestnut  
thence North 69 E twenty two ch and 52 L to a Stake,  
thence North thirty ch and 52 L to the porch or place of  
Beginning, containing two hundred acres more or less  
Together with all and singular the rights, members, bed-  
iments and appurtenances to the said premises  
belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining,  
to have and to hold all and singular the premises  
before mentioned unto the said W.S. Walker and to  
his heirs and assigns forever, and we do hereby  
bind ourselves, and our heirs executors and adminis-  
trators, to warrant and forever defend all and sin-  
gular the said premises unto the said W.S. Walker  
and his heirs and assigns, against us and our heirs  
or any other persons lawfully claiming, or to claim  
the same or any part thereof.
