Mourning Acker widow of Alexander Acker late of the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid send greeting: Whereas the said Alexander Acker did in his lifetime on the seventeenth day of March A.D. 1857 by his deed of conveyance with warranty convey to Charles G. Garrison in fee simple a tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Greenville aforesaid on the North East side of Saluda River containing one hundred and three acres more or less known as the Bridge Tract adjoining lands of Joseph Lechler William Evans Walton Darrant and the Saluda River as will more fully appear by reference to said deed which is duly recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds conveyance for the County of Greenville aforesaid in Book W page 3017302. And whereas the said Charles Garrison now deceased did in his lifetime on the eleventh day of November A.D. 1874 by his deed of conveyance convey in fee simple to George W. Anderson a certain parcel or tract of land lying on the East side of Saluda River above and below Wilsons Bridge in Oak Lawn Township Greenville County containing fifty four acres more or less and having such marks metes and bounds as are described below viz: beginning at a maple 3 x 0 m on the East bank of Saluda River and running thence N 48 W 47.0 to a P.O. 3 x 0 m thence N 57 E 14.34 to a stone 3 x n m thence N 20 1/2 W 21.50 to a stone 3 x n m on Waddy Thompsons line thence along said line S 70 1/2 W 18.50 to a small black Gum 3 x 0 m on the bank of Saluda River thence down the centre of said stream to the beginning corner bounded by lands of Waddy Thompson, S. J. Garrison and Estate of B. Darrant and West and South West by Saluda River as will more fully appear by reference to said deed which is duly recorded in the conveyance office aforesaid in Book 157 page 70 and the said George W. Anderson still continues the owner of the same. And whereas a portion of the first named tract of land above described is included in the last named tract now the property of the said George W. Anderson. And whereas through inadvertence of the said Mourning Acker did not run over my down to the said first mentioned tract of land at the time of its sale by my husband the above act notwithstanding being aware that another man had taken down the same which

by these presents that I the said Mourning Acker in consideration of the premises and for the purpose of rectifying such omission and in further consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to me paid by the said George W. Anderson at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have remised released and forever quit claimed and by these presents do for myself my heirs executors and administrators remain release and forever quit claim unto the said George W. Anderson all such right title interest property possession claim or demand as I have or ought to have in or to the tract of land last above mentioned and described whether by reason of my marriage with my said husband Alexander Acker or by reason of any other matter or thing whatsoever. To have and to hold the said last mentioned tract of land above described unto the said George W. Anderson his heirs and assigns to his and theirs only proper use and behoef forever, so that neither I the said Mourning Acker or any other person in my name and behalf shall or will hereafter claim or demand any right or title to the said premises or any part thereof but they and every of them shall by these presents be excluded and forever barred.
