On whom the same may in any wise concern, I S. J. Douthit master of the County of Greenville in the said State send greeting: Whereas Charles P. Little's administration de bonis non of the Estate of Amelia Hudson deceased on or about the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight did exhibit his complaint in the Court of Common Pleas in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, against John P. Pool and James H. Pool, and the cause being at issue before the honorable Court aforesaid, came on to be heard on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine when the said Court, after a full hearing thereof and mature deliberation in the premises, did order adjudge and decree that the tract of land hereinafter mentioned and described, should be sold at public auction by the Master of Greenville County, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in said decree and order as by reference thereto on file in the said Court will appear; and the said Master after having duly advertised the said tract of land for twenty one days for sale by public outcry, on the third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine, did then openly and publicly, and according to the custom of auctions sell and dispose of the said tract of land below described, unto Henry T. Stroud for the sum of five hundred and sixty dollars he being at that price the highest bidder for the same. Now know all men that I the said S. J. Douthit master of aforesaid instrument do for the sum aforesaid pay and discharge the sum of

of Five hundred and sixty Dollars paid me by the said Henry T. Stroud, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Henry T. Stroud and his heirs and assigns, all that tract of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, on the road leading from Greenville to Batesville Factory, adjoining lands of Mr. Horatio Mason, William Goldsmith and others and containing eighty one and three fourth acres more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever, to the said tract of land belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possession, property, benefit claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said John P. Pool and of all the parties to the said suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof, by, from or under them, or either of them. To have and to hold the said tract of land with its hereditaments privileges, and appurtenances unto the said Henry T. Stroud his heirs and assigns forever.
